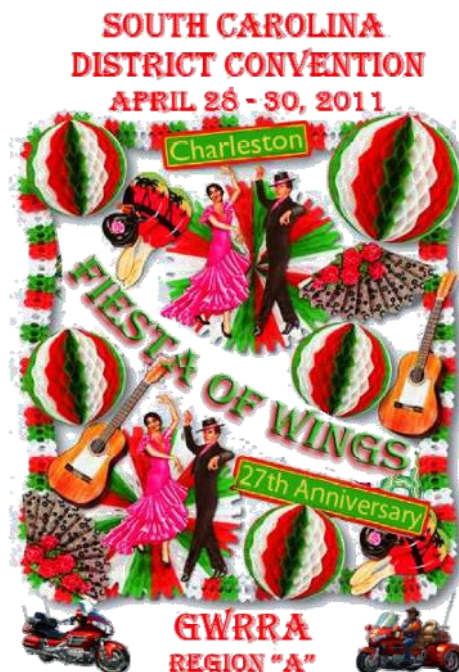

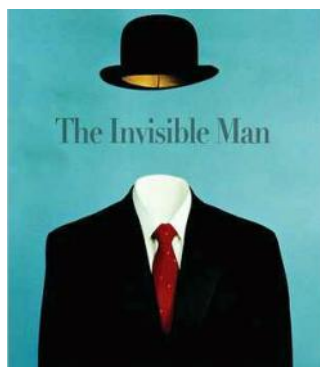


## “How Can I SURVIVE?”

When you were a child did you play hide and seek or play the invisible boy/girl? The outlook of a child is quite different than that of an adult. Lets play a game again. We can play invisible. Now, add riding your motorcycle to our invisible game and thoughts of “how can I SURVIVE?” should be running through your head. As an invisible rider other motorists may do things such as turn in front of you, change lanes, violate your right of way space, etc

We may follow the 3 second rule, give signals well in advance of turns and lane changes, etc., etc., etc. No matter how well you ride, as an invisible entity, you will only get dead quick! No matter what you do, no one can see you or your invisible signals.

What we need to do as riders of visible motorcycles is to:

- leave the extra space between vehicles
- give your signals well in advance of any turns
- do not make stops without more than adequate notice
- wear clothing that increases your visibility to drivers (jackets or pants with protective inserts and also light in color, and also gloves)
- the correct helmet for you
- good riding boots-waterproof and comfortable

Remember those who care about you want you to come home alive and well. So, think about what you wear, and how you ride.

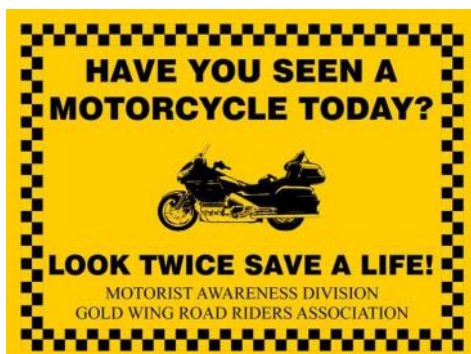

# “How Chapter Y2 Got Started ”

Recently we have had a few questions about the beginnings of the Rocky River Wings. So, in this article, I'll tell the tale, so to speak, as to the beginnings of Chapter Y2. In the spring of 2005, Kathy and I began discussing the idea of starting a new Chapter. We wanted to make new friends and create an atmosphere of fun and camaraderie amongst a group of likeminded motorcycle riding enthusiasts. After finishing our term on the NC District Staff as Leadership Trainers, we wanted to help to expand the influence of GWRRA in our area. We had discussions with others, including Dennis Hull, the Assistant District Director at the time, about the idea of starting a new Chapter in the Monroe area. During the summer of 2005 we began to contact GWRRA Members in the Monroe area listed in the Gold Book. We asked everyone we contacted if they would be interested in a new GWRRA Chapter in the local community. As we discussed the possibilities with those interested, we decided to define our Chapter as a “riding” Chapter, which meant we would do a lot of riding.

Our first unofficial and comprised of a group of 6 ride to Myrtle Beach with Richard and Gina Jones. Needless to riding my GL1500 and Kathy red 750 Honda Shadow. We food buffets in Myrtle Beach. 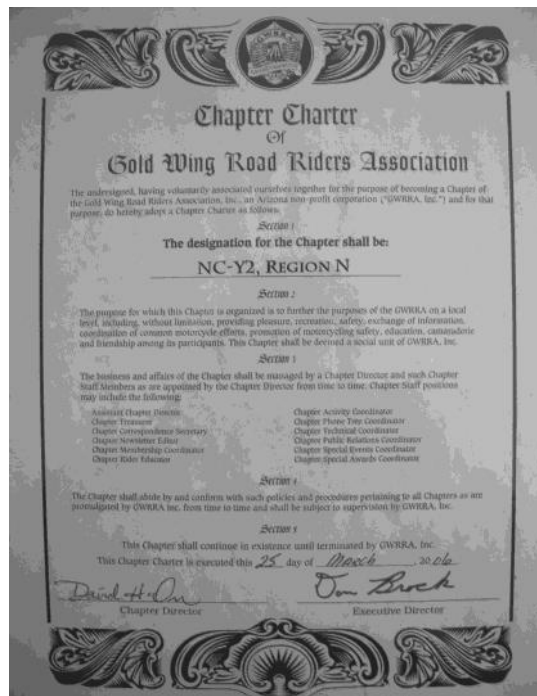
